Mayor Marburger opened the public hearing at 6:03pm.

SPECIAL CANVASSING SESSION

- 1. Discussion and possible action in regard to **Ordinance** #611 of the City of Waller, Texas, canvassing and declaring the results of the May 6, 2023, General Election, for the purpose of electing three Councilmembers At-Large.
- 2. Swearing in Councilmembers.

City Secretary, Cynthia Ward addressed Council in the special canvassing session. Jason Tones had 66 votes, Dwayne Hajek had 67 votes, Sherri Swisher had 40 votes, Don't Hart had 80. The three members appointed for Council were Jason Tones, Dwayne Hajek, and Don Hart.

City Secretary, Cynthia Ward sworn in Councilmember Jason Tones, Dwayne Hajek, and Don Hart.

Councilmember Nancy Arnold motioned to approve. Councilmember Dwayne Hajek seconded the motion. Motion passed.

- 9. Finishes, LLC property:
 - a. Discussion and possible action to approve **Ordinance #612**, granting the request for annexation of a 25.01 acre of land being situated in the John L. Boatright Survey, Abstract No. 81 & Jacob Hall Survey Abstract No. 351 & Hamilton Stuart Survey No. 723, in Harris County, Texas, same being a tract of land conveyed to Stacey Vance Kiser by deed recorded in instrument RP-2019-170794 official public records of Harris County into the City of Waller; providing for the extension of certain boundary limits of the City of Waller, Texas; providing for severability; and making findings and provisions relative to the subject.

Mayor Pro-Tem, Dwayne Hajek motioned to approve. Councilmember Jason Tones seconded the motion. Motion passed.

b. Discussion and possible action to approve Finishes Solutions granting the City of Waller an easement and/or right of way for a water line to extend from FM 362 to the east end of the property where it adjoins with Oakwood Estates.

City Engineer, Travis Sellers addressed Council that the easement meets the City's requirements.

Councilmember Jason Tones motioned to approve. Councilmember Don Hart seconded the motion. Motion passed.

10. Discussion and possible action to approve Resolution #2023-05, authorizing members of the City Council to serve as members of the Waller Volunteer Fire Department.

City Attorney, Art Pertile addressed Council on approving Resolution #2023-05. The law requires that Council should approve by Resolution, for members of a governmental body to be part of the Volunteer Fire Department to avoid illegal conflict of interest.

Councilmember Don Hart motion to approve. Councilmember Jason Tones seconded the motion. Motion passed.

11. Discussion and possible action to approve **Resolution #2023-06**, and a contract agreement with Larson and Weisinger, Attorneys at Law for the collection of delinquent taxes.

13. Discussion and possible action to approve **Resolution #2023-07**, a change order with 5T utilities in the amount of -\$297,367.23.

Public Works Director, Markus Benoit addressed Council on approving Resolution #2023-07. The City will be saving on the sewer extension that went across the highway on Business 290 from Pine Street to lift station. The City will be getting back \$297,367.23, which is money left over from project not used.

14. Discussion and possible action to approve Resolution #2023-08, a change order with AAA Asphalt in the amount of -\$33,225.09.

City Engineer, Travis Sellers addressed Council on approving Resolution #2023-08, a change order. The change order is in the amount of \$33,225.09. This money will be refunded to the City.

Public Works Director, Markus Benoit addressed Council on approving to declare a generator and woodchipper as surplus and to be taken to auction. The items are no longer safe to use due to aging.

16. Discussion and possible action to approve WEX Fuel Services for fuel cards.

Public Works Director, Markus Benoit addressed Council on approving WEX Fuel Services for fuel cards. WEX Fuel Services would save the City money on fuel cards.

17. Discussion and possible action to approve Ordinance #613, authorizing "No Thru Trucks" along the road corridors between Penick Street and Washington Street.

Public Works Director, Markus Benoit addressed Council on approving Ordinance #613. There will be about 19 No Thru Trucks signs between Penick and Washington Street. The truck drivers have gotten stuck in the neighborhoods and has caused dangerous situations.

18. Discussion and possible action to approve Resolution #2023-09, supporting the City of Waller's detailed application for a TxDOT's Transportation Alternatives for the Fieldstore Rd. sidewalk project.

EDC Director, John Isom addressed Council on approving Resolution #2023-09. The resolution does not bind the City with an agreement. The resolution will be a step in the application process.

19. Discussion and possible action to approve The Goodman Corporation to issue an RFQ for design services for the Taylor St. & Waller-Tomball Rd. sidewalk project.

EDC Director, John Isom addressed Council on approving The Goodman Corporation to issue an RFQ for design services. The project is ready for the City to advertise for RFQ's and select a designer for the sidewalk project.
